FROM THE PASTOR



Luke 14:15-24, One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, "Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!" Then Jesus said to him, "Someone

gave a great dinner and invited many. At the time for the dinner he sent his slave to say to those who had been invited, 'Come; for everything is ready now.' But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of land, and I must go out and see it; please accept my regrets.' Another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to try them out; please accept my regrets.' Another said, 'I have just been married, and therefore I cannot come.' So the slave returned and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and said to his slave, 'Go out at once into the streets and lanes of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame.' And the slave said, 'Sir, what you ordered has been done, and there is still room.' Then the master said to the slave, 'Go out into the roads and lanes, and compel people to come in, so that my house may be filled. For I tell you, none of those who were invited will taste my dinner.'"

I was talking to a pastor the other day who said to me, "God goes to the places where people are leaving." Since hearing those words, I have wondered if we as God's people are going to the places where God is going. Jesus went to the Samaritans when Jews would add hours and days to a journey just to evade the area where the Samaritan people lived. Jesus went to heal the lepers who were told to cry out that they were lepers around other people so they could be avoided. Jesus ate with sinners and with people of ill repute when He had the option to eat with the religious and social elite. He could have gained the support and adoration

of those in power if He wanted, but Jesus went to the people which the powerful and well to do kept away. Jesus even went to those who others tried to keep away from Him (Mark 10:46-52).



Many of us have options and choices of whom we will seek out and with whom we will associate. We can choose what places we go to shop, eat, and have choices of what we will do with our time. Will we choose to go where God is going? Will we follow when the Holy Spirit is leading us to those places? I believe that our church is already going to many of the places where God is going and I hope if you are not involved in those places you would come along. While many people walk away from those who are trying to recover from addiction, God is going to them and asking us to follow. While our government has to create incentives because many people do not want to teach in inner city schools, God is going there to minister. As many people are leaving the streets of certain areas of Canton, God is going to them and calling us to follow. When many people would rather spend their evenings in the quiet of their own home, God is reaching out to youth and young families. As many people want to stay ensconced in a Christian bubble insulated from things that may threaten their beliefs, God is going to places to reach new people. There are many places where we see God moving in and through the ministry of our church and I hope that you will come and experience the presence of God as you join in ministry.
